

PETITION.



To the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia in Parliament Assembled:

The humble petition of John Cobeldick, of the City of Vancouver, sheweth:—

That your petitioner is desirous of incorporating a company for the purpose of promoting, stimulating and encouraging invention and application, with a view to the discovery and introduction of better mechanical means and chemical methods for the mining, winning and recovery of the gold and other precious substances believed to be contained in the submerged glacial and other auriferous gravel deposits of the Province of British Columbia, and having the right to acquire and win precious metals and substances, and to operate and mine by such inventions and improved methods, in a certain defined area, and all other rights, powers and privileges necessary, incidental or convenient to the exercise of the above powers, or conducive to the attainment of the above objects, or any of them.

Your petitioner, therefore, humbly prays that your Honourable House will be pleased to pass an Act incorporating the “British Columbian Great Gold Gravels Dredge Mining Corporation,” with the rights, powers and privileges above set out.

And your petitioner, as in duty bound, will ever pray, etc., etc.
